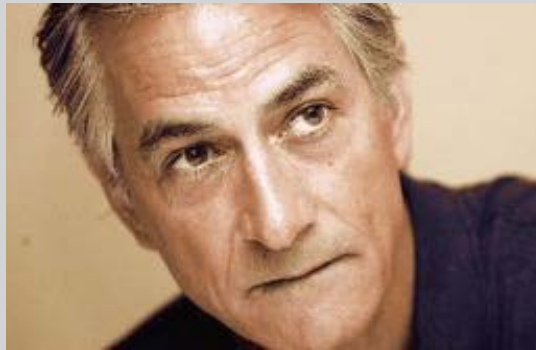

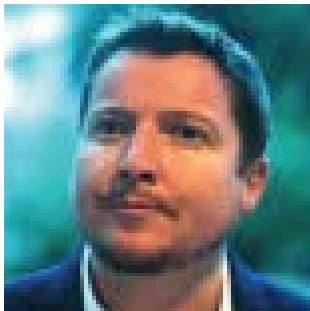

MacDara King, Executive Producer

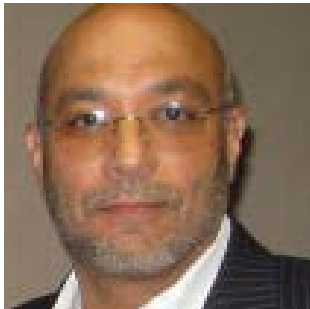
